

Phrasal Verbs: Drop

Drop back	*to move down a position	My favorite horse dropped back into fourth place and lost the race.
Drop in/by	*to visit somebody or something	Let's drop in on Grandma before we go to the beach.
Drop off	to leave by car/bus/boat *to slow down	Larry always drops me off at the airport when I fly back to Miami. The number of tourists drops off in May.
Drop out	*to quit school or a club	Steve Jobs dropped out of college to start a computer company.
<p>Important: The phrasal verbs with an asterisk (*) are inseparable. When the direct object is a pronoun, it must be placed in the middle of a two-word phrasal verb. Example: Larry picked her up. NOT: Larry picked up her.</p>
