



Present Simple (Beginner)

We use the Present Simple to describe habits / routines and facts / generalizations.

AFFIRMATIVE FORM	
I / You / We / They + V1	**If a verb ends with a consonant + 'y,' delete 'y' and add 'ies': fly > flies pay > pays cry > cries buy > buys
He / She / It + V1 + S**	
<p>1. Habit / Routine</p>  <p>I teach English everyday. You do homework in the afternoon. She does homework in the evening. The class begins at 11:00.</p>	<p>2. Facts or Generalizations.</p>  <p>She likes Pepsi. Americans drive big cars. The teachers teach in the morning. Miami is in Florida.</p>

We can also use the Present Simple in a negative form by using DON'T/DOESN'T

NEGATIVE FORM	
I / You / We / They + DO NOT + VERB (DON'T)	I don't teach English everyday. She doesn't do homework in the evening. The class doesn't begin at 11:00. She doesn't like Pepsi.
He / She / It + DOES NOT + VERB (DOESN'T)	

When the verb BE is used, we use a different form.

NEGATIVE FORM OF 'TO BE'	
I + AM NOT	I am not a doctor. OR I'm not a doctor.
He / She / It + IS NOT (ISN'T)	He isn't in school today. OR He's not in school today.
You / We / They + ARE NOT (AREN'T)	You aren't an astronaut. OR You're not an astronaut.
