

Should for Ideas and Opinions (Beginner)

We use 'should' to give **advice**, such as an **idea** or an **opinion**.

<p>SHOULD + VERB** / SHOULD NOT + VERB** (SHOULDN'T)</p> <p>** Remember: ALWAYS use the BASE FORM of the verb, NEVER add 'to', and NEVER conjugate the verb!!!</p>	
<p>CORRECT The boy should do his homework. You shouldn't work so hard.</p>	<p>INCORRECT The boy should does his homework. You shouldn't to work so hard.</p>
<p>EXAMPLES: What should I eat? You should eat a salad. You are on a diet. You shouldn't smoke so much. It is very bad for your health. When you visit Florida you should go to Key West. It is a lot of fun!</p>
